

How to set your PIN and activate your card in the BNZ app

This guide will help you to set or change your PIN for your BNZ Eftpos, Flexi Debit Visa, or Visa credit card^{*}, as well as activate your card. Your new card will arrive within 5-10 business days after it has been ordered. When you receive it, please follow the simple steps below.

To get started, you need to have the BNZ app set up on your device and be registered for Internet Banking. If you're not, don't worry, it's easy to get set up, and we have a supporting guide if you need it. Register at **bnz.co.nz**

1. How to set a PIN on your Flexi Debit Visa or Visa credit card

Use this guide when you receive a new card.

Step 1. Log in to the BNZ app and tap the menu icon **≡** in the top-left corner. Then tap **Cards** from the menu.

You'll see which of your cards need to be activated.



*This feature does not apply to corporate and purchasing cards.



Step 2. Select the card you want to activate, then tap **Set PIN** and **Activate card**.

Tip: To check your physical card matches the card displayed in the app, compare the last 4 digits.

Step 3. Verify your card by entering the 3-digit number in the signature panel on the back of your physical card.

If the number doesn't match what we have on file, you will get an error message. If this happens, check you have the new card, confirm the number and enter it again.

Step 4. When the number matches, a green tick will appear.

2. How to set a PIN on your new Eftpos card, or change your PIN

Use this guide when you receive a new card, or with your current card.

Step 1. Log in to the BNZ app and tap the menu icon \equiv in the top-left corner. Then tap **Cards** from the menu.



Step 2. Select your card.

Tip: To check your physical card matches the card displayed in the app, compare the last 4 digits.





Step 3. Tap Manage PIN.



Step 4. Tap **Next** to set your PIN, then enter a 4-digit PIN.

3. How to activate your Flexi Debit Visa or Visa credit card

Use this guide when you automatically receive a replacement card.

Step 1. Log in to the BNZ app and tap the menu icon \equiv in the top-left corner. Then tap **Cards** from the menu.

You'll see which of your cards need to be activated.



Step 2. Select the card you want to activate, then tap **Activate Card**.

Tip: To check your physical card matches the card displayed in the app, compare the last 4 digits.



Step 3. Verify your card by entering the 3-digit number in the signature panel on the back of your physical card.

Enter the 3 numbers in the signature panel on the back of your Flexi Debit Visa.





Step 4. When the number matches, a green tick will appear.





Step 6. Re-enter the same PIN to confirm it.

Once you've confirmed your PIN, your replacement card is now activated and ready to use.





4. How to change your PIN on your Flexi Debit Visa or Visa credit card

Use this guide with your current card.

Step 1. Log in to the BNZ app and tap the menu icon ≡ in the top-left corner. Then tap **Cards** from the menu.



Step 2. Select the card you want to change the PIN for and then tap **Manage PIN**.

Tip: To check your physical card matches the card displayed in the app, compare the last 4 digits.

Step 3. Verify your card by entering the 3-digit number in the signature panel on the back of your physical card.

If the number doesn't match what we have on file, you will get an error message. If this happens, check the number and enter it again.







Step 4. When the number matches, a green tick will appear.
