#### What is the purpose of this update?


#### Description of this Fund

The Conservative Fund invests mostly in income assets, which generally have lower levels of risk with the potential for lower returns. It also has a modest allocation to growth assets, which generally have higher levels of risk and potential returns. It aims to achieve relatively stable returns over the short to medium term.

# Risk indicator<sup>2</sup> for the Conservative Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down (volatility). A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.




# Example of how this applies to an investor

John had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, John received a return after Fund charges were deducted of \$367.00 (that is 3.67% of his initial \$10,000). John also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives John a total return of \$367.00 for the year.


This shows the types of assets the Fund invests in.

# Currency hedging

Currency hedging may be used to mitigate the impact of currency movements on investments in foreign securities. As at the date of this Fund Update, the Manager applies the following currency hedging ratios:

- 100% of the Fund's international fixed interest exposure
- 40% of Fund's international equities exposure
- 100% of the Fund's Australian equities exposure

#### Notes

- 1. This Fund changed its name from the Income Fund to the Conservative Fund effective 29 September 2020.
- 2. As the Fund has been operating for less than five years, we have used a mix of actual and market index returns for the five-year period to 30 September 2020 to calculate its risk indicator. This means it may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the Fund. The inception date for the Conservative Fund was 21 May 2018. The Conservative Fund's risk indicator is based on market index returns from 1 October 2015 to 31 May 2018 and actual returns from 1 June 2018 to 30 September 2020.
- 3. The calculation of cash and cash equivalents within the actual investment mix allocation may include investor flows not yet unitised, liquidity cash and fund accruals but excludes cash and cash equivalents held by our investment managers for operational and hedging purposes which are categorised within the asset class to which they apply.
- 4. Australasian equities and international equities may include an allocation to listed property securities.
- 5. The Conservative Fund is transitioning to a new Target investment mix effective 30 October 2020. To understand the target investment mix that applies from 30 October, please refer to the Statement of Investment Policy and Objective (SIPO) dated 29 September 2020. - 6. Investor flows not yet unitised, unsettled trades, currency hedging gains (or losses) and any operating accruals are excluded from the Top 10 investments.
