

Fund Update

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the International Equity Fund (Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. 
Description of this Fund

The International Equity Fund provides an exposure to international shares by primarily investing in a diversified portfolio of shares in developed markets, with the ability to invest to a lesser extent in emerging market countries. It aims to provide a gross return in excess of its benchmark index, over the long term.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator¹ for the International Equity Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down (volatility). A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



How has the Fund performed?

The graph shows the return after Fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the Fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the Fund started, up to 30 June 2019.

What fees are investors charged?


Example of how this applies to an investor

John had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, John received a return after Fund charges were deducted of \$562.00 (that is 5.62% of his initial \$10,000). John also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives John a total return of \$562.00 for the year.

This shows the types of assets the Fund invests in.


Actual investment mix*

Currency hedging

• International equities - 40% hedged to NZD (target 50%)

Notes

- 1. As the Fund has not been in existence for 5 years, a combination of actual returns and market index returns have been used to calculate the Fund's risk indicator. The risk indicator, therefore, may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the Fund.
- 2. Cash and cash equivalents held at our investment managers for operational and hedging purposes are excluded from the top 10 investments. This list has also been amended to separate individual assets i.e. where different Alphabet shares were amalgamated in previous fund updates, these are now shown as individual holdings.
