

Fund Update

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the International Equity Fund (Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. 
Description of this Fund

The International Equity Fund provides an exposure to international shares by primarily investing in a diversified portfolio of shares in developed markets, with the ability to invest to a lesser extent in emerging market countries. It aims to provide a gross return in excess of its benchmark index, over the long term.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator¹ for the International Equity Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down (volatility). A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

To help you clarify your own attitude to risk, you can seek financial advice or work out your risk profile at **sorted.org.nz**. Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.



How has the Fund performed?

The graph shows the return after Fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the Fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the Fund started, up to 31 December 2018.

What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the International Equity Fund are charged Fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2018 these were (excluding GST):

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


Example of how this applies to an investor

John had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, John incurred a loss after Fund charges were deducted of \$590.00 (that is -5.90% of his initial \$10,000). John also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives John a total loss of \$590.00 for the year.

This shows the types of assets the Fund invests in.


Actual investment mix*

Currency hedging

Currency hedging may be used to mitigate the impact of currency movements on investments in foreign securities. As at 31 December 2018, currency hedging is as follows:

• International equities - 40% hedged to NZD (target 50%)

Notes
