What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the International Equity Fund (Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. 
Description of this Fund

The International Equity Fund invests in international equities primarily in developed markets, with the ability to invest to a lesser extent in emerging market countries. It aims to provide a gross return in excess of its benchmark index, over the long term.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator¹ for the International Equity Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down (volatility). A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



How has the Fund performed?


Example of how this applies to an investor

John had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, John received a return after Fund charges were deducted of \$778.00 (that is 7.78% of his initial \$10,000). John also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives John a total return of \$778.00 for the year.

What does the Fund invest in?


This shows the types of assets the Fund invests in.

Currency hedging

Currency hedging may be used to mitigate the impact of currency movements on investments in foreign securities. As at the date of this Fund Update, the Manager applies the following currency hedging ratio:

• 40% of the fund's international equities exposure

Notes

- 1. As the Fund has not been in existence for 5 years, we have used a mix of actual and market index returns for the 5-year period to 31 December 2020 to calculate the risk indicators. Therefore, the risk indicators may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the Fund. The inception date for the Fund was in March 2017. We have calculated the risk indicators using market index returns from 1 January 2016 to 31 March 2017 and actual returns from 1 April 2017 until 31 December 2020.
- 2. The calculation of cash and cash equivalents within the actual investment mix allocation may include investor flows not yet unitised, liquidity cash and fund accruals but excludes cash and cash equivalents held by our investment managers for operational and hedging purposes which are categorised within the asset class to which they apply.
- 3. International equities may include an allocation to listed property securities.
- 4. Investor flows not yet unitised, unsettled trades, currency hedging gains (or losses) and any operating accruals are excluded from the Top 10 investments.
